Dear Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that by a unanimous vote of this Committee, Oxford has been approved of as the seat of the next International Congress of Orientalists.

At the close of the session of the last Congress at Athens, the Committee was chosen not only to resolve the question of the seat of the next Congress, but also to revise the statutes. In order to carry out any such revision, it will be necessary to hold a meeting of the Committee at Oxford.

Meanwhile I should be obliged if you would favour me with the wording of any point of revision in the Paris statutes which to you may seem advisable. I will then send such suggestions to all the other members of the Committee, so that we shall be prepared to draw up a Report in time for consideration at the Oxford Congress.
