My dear Mr. Goldziher:

During the last few years the country has been stirred by the agitation due to the re-opening of the Chinese question, and to the violent opposition to Japanese immigration which developed on the Pacific Coast.

The discussion of the question in the Eastern and Southern sections of the country disclosed the fact that the point of view of the Far West was entirely misunderstood. As a national organization, free from all political affiliations, the Academy is now in a position to undertake an examination of the question as viewed by the different sections of the country. With this end in view the Academy is about to publish a special volume on "The Chinese and Japanese in America".

In order to carry out this plan the Academy must have the co-operation of those who are interested in these problems. Our Board would like to see you enrolled amongst our members, and I have been directed to extend to you an invitation to such enrolment.

As you probably know, members of the Academy receive six special volumes each year. The only financial obligation involved is the payment of the annual membership fee of five dollars. If you will give this matter early attention, I will see to it that action is taken without delay.
