1. The title of the work shall be "A Jewish Encyclopedia," the subtitle, "A Comprehensive Record of the History and Mental Development of the Jewish Race."

2. The Encyclopedia shall be prepared under the direction of the Editor-in-Chief, who shall be advised and assisted in his labors by a

Board of Twelve Associate Editors, all residing in the United States, and an Advisory Committee of about twenty-four foreign scholars.

3. The principal functions of the Board of Editors shall be to advise the Editor-in-Chief on all questions connected with the Encyclopedia, to wit: (1) The choice of topics to be considered, (2) The choice of contributors, (3) The distribution of articles among the contributors, (4) The allotting of the space to be occupied by each article, (5) The selection of illustrations, (6) The revising of articles written by writers in the office, or by those who are not recognized as of unquestioned authority, (7) The revising of translated articles in order to see that all points worth preserving shall be retained.

4. The duties of the Advisory Committee will be to assist the Board of Associate Editors on all important questions on which the Board may be in doubt, or, in case of a tie-vote, decide the course to be adopted. (Original Knowledge) or 1,000 words; if written in foreign language, such as The editors and collaborators shall prepare their copy with the view of reducing typographical corrections to a minimum. Authors' corrections must all be made on the first galley proof. Only four proofs shall be furnished, viz.: (1) First galley proof, (2) revise of galley proof, (3) first page proof, (4) cast page proof.
5. Proofs in all articles written in English shall be sent to their authors for corrections, who will be expected to do this work with such regularity and precision as will insure the release of set type with the least possible delay; control of the production of the Encyclopedia when it shall be made available, each important disputed question shall be treated by an authoritative writer, representing each side.
6. Every article treating an important subject shall be signed by the contributor, or, when the capital invested in the work, the publishers receive it, the manuscript copy of the Encyclopedia shall be handed to the Style Editor appointed by the Funk & Wagnalls Co., to whom he shall be solely responsible, and he shall examine the same for the purpose, of determining if the copy be in form for the printers.
7. It is expressly understood that no engagements of an editorial character, and collaborators or translators, or the obtaining of illustrative material, which involve financial outlay, shall be made without consulting the representative of the Funk & Wagnalls Co. under whose direction, and with the express sanction of the Funk & Wagnalls Co., they may be made and shall be binding.

12. The remuneration of collaborators for original manuscript shall  
be on the uniform scale of \$5. per page (size of Schaff-Herzog Cyclopedias  
of Religious Knowledge) of 1,000 words; if written in foreign language,  
such as French or German, \$4 per page.

13. An accredited representative of the Funk & Wagnalls Company  
shall be present at all conferences of the Board of Associate Editors.  
All such conferences shall be conducted in English.

14. The Representative of the Funk & Wagnalls Company shall re-  
present more directly the publishers and shall have the general super-  
vision of the work.

15. The Manufacturing Department of the Funk & Wagnalls Company  
shall have absolute control of the production of the Encyclopedia when it  
shall have reached the printing and manufacturing stage, and shall be re-  
sponsible for the illustrative cuts and typography.

16. In the event of any difference occurring between the collabora-  
tors, which threatens the capital invested in the work, the publishers  
reserve the right to take such steps as they may deem necessary to save  
their capital.

17. The entire work of twelve volumes of from 600 to 700 pages  
each, the page to be about the size of the pages in the Preliminary Pro-  
spectus, or of the Schaff-Herzog Encyclopedia, must be completed within  
four years from the date of signing the contract, as follows:

Two volumes shall appear  
during the first year; Three Volumes shall appear during the second year;  
Three Volumes shall appear during the third year; Four volumes shall  
APPEAR DURING THE FOURTH YEAR.

18. The Editor-in-Chief shall carry on the work subject to the  
above conditions.
