Dear Professor Goldziher:

I beg to invite you herewith to become a contributor (rate of payment \$20 per 1000 words) to this first Biblical Encyclopedia for the Layman whose principal new feature will be the presentation of an up-to-date commentary in alphabetical order, with the Bible text - the Apocrypha and the Apocalyptic literature included - as continuous background. The work will thus present an illustrated Anthology, Commentary and Encyclopedia of the O.T., rolled into one single work, and will again make the knowledge of the Bible familiar in thousands of households.

E. g., the article on Samson will start with the reproduction of Judges XIII-XVII, to be followed by a popularly written commentary en bloc, the whole interspersed with the illustrations of the subject by the most famous artists. The smaller books, such as Ruth, Jonah, etc., will be given in full. The hundreds of proper names which have no significance for the layman, will be summarily omitted. But, on the other hand, the work will incorporate the first illustrated Encyclopedia of Palestine. Special care will be bestowed upon the department: The O.T. in Rabbinical Literature. (s.J.E.)

The work will, further, offer the first compilation, arranged alphabetically according to authors, of the best that has ever been written on the beauties of the O.T. and its position in the world's literature. It will, finally, include biographical sketches of the hundreds of prominent Biblical scholars, archeologists, etc., who have done yeoman work in the field of the interpretation of the O.T.

Every one of your suggestions will be greatly welcomed and taken into the most serious consideration. In brief, you can rest assured that the publishers will make of this work a worthy companion to their McClintock and Strong.
