My dear Prof. Goldziher:-

You will certainly be interested to learn that I have returned to the Jewish literary field with this new undertaking of mine, a kind of Oncken, although, of course, on a smaller scale. Since I am loath to ask third or fourth rate compilers to write up what the leaders of Jewish literature, living and dead, have said in masterly fashion, I will, as far as possible, reproduce the master pieces in Jewish monography, filling only the gaps in the tableau by direct contributions.

So much said, let me ask you whether and under what conditions, you, yourself, and your publishers would permit us to make use of some of your own contributions to Jewish literature.

It will, finally, probably interest you to learn that the Jewish Encyclopedia has been not only a great literary but also a considerable financial success, since we were able to sell, up to this day, about 10,000 sts of the work: a fact which certainly has never been equalled in the annals of Jewish literature, if we consider the price and the scholarly character of the book.
