My dear Professor Goldziher:

Your postal of the 2nd of June was duly received and I have made inquiries of the publishers, Houghton, Mifflin & Co., as to the shipment of the Volumes. Volume I of the Proceedings of the Congress of Arts and Science was shipped on February 10, together with eight other volumes destined for the Austrian speakers, to Commissioner General Herr Adalbert R. von Stibral, Imperial Ministry of Commerce, Vienna. Volumes II and III were shipped in April to the Exposition Department, Ministry of Commerce, Vienna, Austria. This change in address was made at the request of Commissioner General von Stibral who stated that he would be away from Austria for some time and that it would be better to send the volumes in care of the Exposition Department of the Ministry of Commerce.

These books were forwarded by express through Messrs Davies, Turner & Co. of Boston, and we have instructed them to trace the package with a view to fixing the responsibility for
