Dear Sir: --

We have ordered our forwarding department to send you a copy of the first volume of THE JEWISH ENCYCLOPEDIA, which volume we have recently published. In asking your acceptance of this book we shall feel grateful for any expression of opinion that you may care to make in regard to the same or to the entire undertaking.

That you may appreciate the vastness of the enterprise which we have now under way, permit us to say that THE JEWISH ENCYCLOPEDIA, when complete, will comprise twelve volumes of the same size as the volume sent you herewith. These volumes will be embellished with more than 2,000 illustrations, many of which will be printed in colors and be facsimiles of the originals now found only in private collections, various museums, and libraries of the world.

Before you peruse the pages of Volume I of this work, we wish to emphasize the fact that our editors have endeavored to produce a reliable record of the history of the Jews from the time of Abraham to the present day. You will readily understand that in the production of such a work absolute accuracy in all details is not possible; but the standard which has guided our editors has been high, and great

efforts have been made to maintain it. Nevertheless we realize that the best human effort is not infallible; and we shall feel grateful if you will bear this in mind in whatever criticism you may feel disposed to make of the volume we forward you.

Are we wrong in accepting the judgment of Dr. Jacob Voorsanger, Professor of Semitic Languages in the University of California, in declaring the publication of THE JEWISH ENCYCLOPEDIA "the most remarkable work published to the world since the close of the Talmud," and one that will mark a new epoch in the history of Judaism? In view of this, and of the vastness of the enterprise and of, we hope, the meritorious character of the volume, will you favor us by an expression of opinion in a few words? If you contribute to the press we shall be glad if you will take occasion to write a review of this volume, and forward us copies of the periodical in which this review appears.

It may not be inappropriate to mention here the fact that more than \$100,000 were spent in the production of the first volume; and it is estimated that the total outlay for the production of the twelve volumes of this Encyclopedia, in a manner that shall in every way equal the standard of excellence set by the first volume, will aggregate not less than three-quarters of a million dollars.

Any opinion that you may care to express, or any attention that you may draw to facts, modification of which will improve the standard of the Encyclopedia, is cordially invited, and will be submitted by us to our Editorial Board, to be carefully considered before we go to press with a second edition.
