



AGREEMENT BETWEEN PROF. IGNAZ GOLDZIHNER & THE AMERICAN COMMITTEE FOR  
LECTURES ON THE HISTORY OF RELIGIONS.



1. Professor Goldziher agrees to deliver a course of six lectures on Islam beginning about Oct. 6th, 1906, on such days as shall be arranged for by the Committee, in eight places as follows:

Boston at the Lowell Institute  
 Hartford at the Hartford Theological Seminary  
 New York at the Union Theological Seminary  
 Brooklyn at the Brooklyn Institute  
 Philadelphia at the Drexel Institute  
 Baltimore at the Johns Hopkins University  
 Meadville at the Meadville Theological Seminary  
 Chicago at the University of Chicago

2. Professor Goldziher agrees not to accept engagements to lecture in this country or elsewhere without the consent of the Committee.
3. Professor Goldziher agrees to deliver the Mas. of the lectures into the hands of the Committee after the completion of the course, and to turn over to the Committee the full copyright of the lectures.
4. In return the Committee agrees to pay Professor Goldziher the sum of \$2500. in the following installments:

\$300. after the delivery of the lectures in the first center the same sum after the delivery of the course in the second and third centers, <sup>and</sup> and \$350. after the delivery of the course in the fourth center, making a total of \$1250. Of the remaining half \$625. to be paid to Professor Goldziher on his delivering the Mas. into the hands of the Committee of Publication, entirely ready for publication, and the Balance (\$625.) with the publication of the work, less any corrections made by the author in proof beyond the ordinary amount allowed by publishers which, according to the agreement between the Committee and its publishers, G. P. Putnam's Sons, is <sup>10%</sup> ~~10%~~ of the cost of <sup>typesetting</sup> the plates.

5. Lastly, the Committee agrees to publish in good form Professor

Goldziher's lectures on receiving the Mss. and will place six copies at the disposal of Professor Goldziher.
