Dear Prof. Lukács,

At the suggestion of Dr. Robert S. Cohen, I write to ask if I may come to see you during my visit to Hungary, about October 13-19. I shall be gathering material for a book on new attitudes in socialist countries of Eastern Europe, on alienation and humanism, moral versus material incentives, effects of industrialization and urbanization on people, Marxism and morals, ends and means, and automation and the use of leisure time.

I am not a philosopher, but have written a book on Poland (1949) and one on Bulgaria (1965; see enclosed leaflet). In the latter book I touched upon, but did not develop, the topics mentioned above.

I plan to leave here August 23, spend the first half of September in Poland and the second half in Bulgaria; then visit Yugoslavia, Rumania, Hungary and Czechoslovakia.

When I get to Budapest I shall telephone you, in the hope that it would be convenient for you if I came to see you some time during my stay there.
