We do hope they will arrive shortly. It is quite usual that a package from London by surface mail takes more than two months to reach us, so that to Hungary from Tokyo it may take longer. Wittgenstein's and de Bruyne's books, which our book-importer KINOKUNIYA has ordered for us have not reached here yet. Books seem to take frightful amounts of time to travel intercontinentally. Dear Prof. Lukács:

We have gratefully received your letter of September 2 and apologize for our slowness in acknowledging it.

Moreover, we must request for your forgiveness for our inability to have Wittgenstein's TRACTATUS LOGIO-PHILOSOPHICUS and de Bruyne's ETUDES D'ESTHETIQUE MEDIEVALE sent directly to you from their publishers. The reason is that the UNESCO coupons which we thought we could use for this transaction have been recently given up in our country for the exhaustion of our deposits for this purpose.

Consequently the book-importer whom we have asked to send in our orders for the above books (we ourselves are not permitted to buy books directly from foreign publishers) tells us that the ordered books will have to be delivered to him first and then mailed to you from us. This is a frightful waste of time, but under our regid foreign exchange control system, this seems to be the only possible way at present. We must allow at least two months for obtaining a book from Europe by seamail and as we have not obtained the ordered books yet, we must request you to wait a few months longer before the above books will be finally delivered to you.

We mailed on August 23rd Needham's SCIENCE AND CIVILIZATION IN CHINA, I & II, and Thomson's STUDIES IN ANCIENT GREEK SOCIETY and THE FIRST PHILOSOPHERS, so that they will reach you shortly if not already arrived. If anything has gone amiss with them, please let us know. Our book importing agent has ordered for a copy of SCIENCE AND CIVILIZATION, Vol.III to be sent to us as soon as it is out. We hope we shall get it for you before long.

We are ashamed to say that the last volume of our Symposium on Contemporary Thoughts in which are to be printed the contributions from prominent thinkers of the world, is being still delayed in its editorial process because of one extremely delayed article. It is expected to be published very late in November or possibly early in December. As soon as we know the definite date of publication we shall write to you again.

Meanwhile I am writing to you by request of Mr. Yoshino, our editor-in-chief, in order to apologize for the slowness of our process for obtaining the books you desire and also for the publication of the last volume of our symposium.

Dear Prof. Likács:

We have just received notice from our licensed book-importer whom we have asked to obtain a copy of L. Wittgenstein; Tractatus Logico-Philosophicus and A. de Bruyne; Etudes d'Esthétique Médiévale. He reports that the ordered copy of Wittgenstein's book has been mailed directly to you from the London publisher, Routeledge & Kegan Paul Ltd., 68-74 Carter Lane, London E.C.4. It may have reached you by now.

To our surprise the same book-importer told us that a copy of G. Thomson's Studies in Ancient Greek Society has also been mailed to you directly from the London publisher. I think we mailed to you in August 1957 a copy of the same book together with the same author's The First Philosophers and J. Needham's Science and Civilization in China, Vols. I & II. If you have got two copies of the same book, please keep both of them as this has happened entirely through our mistake. We shall of course count the price of only one copy.

As for de Bruyne's <u>Etudes....</u>, our book-importer has not heard from the publisher at all, since he has placed his order for us. We have asked him to make inquiries.

The <u>yen</u> price of Wittgenstein's book is 1,200 <u>yen</u>. The four books we mailed to you last August - of which all the four have reached you by now, we hope - came up to ¥16,236, as we reported to you in our letter of August 12, 1957. The amount spent so far is ¥17,432.

We shall get Needham's Science and Civilization inChina, Vol.III as soon as it is out. Very probably there will be still a considerable amount left out of the \$100 or \(\frac{2}{36},000 \), after paying for this volume and for de Bruyne's Etudes. If you would like some other books sent to you, please let us know. Only, you will please be kind enough to forgive our awful slowness.

If there has been anything amiss with the mailed books, please let us know.

Dear Prof. Lukács:

Thank you very much for your letter of February 1, informing us of the arrival to you of Contemporary Thoughts, Vol.XII and of both Wittgenstein's and de Bruye's books, at which we were greatly relieved.

Our book-importer has not received yet from the Bruges publisher the invoice for de Bruyne's book, so that we cannot make out the account yet. At any rate there will be a considerable amount still left out of the \$100, so that we request you to direct us as to the disposition of the remaining sum. We shall be happy to get some more books if you so desire and if you will forgive the slowness of our transaction.

As for the extra copy of Thomson's Studies in Ancient Greek Society that was sent to you, we must explain that, when we first made inquiry, our customary book-importer had only Volume II of Thomson's work and so we got that volume from him and asked him to order Volume I for us. Then one of our young men found a copy of the same Volume I at another bookstore. We sent these two volumes to you last August and forgot to cancel our order at the frist bookstore. This was the cause of our mistake.

Now, would it be possible for us to request you to kindly mail back to us one of the two copis of Studies in Ancient Greek Society possibly the one arriving first, as we remember this copy was quite soiled and looked shabby? We request you to keep the newly arrived copy, which must be new and clean.

Dear Prof. Lukács:

We have gratefully received your letter of March 4. We must first of all aplogize for our misreading your previous letter and thinking that de Bruyne's book had been delivered to you directly from the publishers at Bruges. Our book importer is now making further inquiries about our order for that book.

It is very kind of you to send back to us one copy of Thomson's Studies in Ancient Greek Society. We request you to send back to us the older, soiled copy that arrived first. And we once more apologize for causing you this awful trouble.

We are happy indeed to get the additional books you mentioned in your letter. Our book-importer had a copy of German Novel by Roy Pascal and so we got it and mailed to you last week. Its price in Japanese yen is ¥1,650 but we got 10% discount so that the actual price was ¥1,485.

For Hauser's Sozialgeschichte von Kunst und Literatur, 2 vols. and Rosztowcew's Geschichte der alten Welt, 2 vols., our book-importer has sent in orders to their publishers in Munchen and Bremen. Only we must request you to give us several months before they will be actually delivered to you.

The prices in Japanese yen will be \(\frac{3}{3}\),500 for the two volumes of Hauser's work and \(\frac{1}{3}\),080 for Volume I and \(\frac{1}{3}\)980 for Volume II of Rosztowcew's work. The five additional books will amount to \(\frac{1}{3}\)7,045, so that, after paying for all the books including Needham's Science and Civilization in China, Volume III and de Bruyne's \(\frac{1}{3}\)Etudes..., there will still be some amount left out of the \\$100 or \(\frac{1}{3}\)36,000.

I have most gratefully received your two letters of October 13 and November 7, and humbly apologize for this delay in answering them.

We are very happy to know that you have got a copy (two copies, in fact!) of Needham's SCIENCE AND CIVILIZATION IN CHINA, Volume III, directly from Cambridge University Press. We have got in touch with the Japanese agent of Cambridge University Press in Tokyo and paid for the book, which was £5/6/3- or ¥5,336.- in Japanese currency. I enclose herewith the receipt thereof.

As you will remember, my letter of February 5, 1959, gives the last account of the money we owe you. It said that we still held \(\frac{1}{2}6,019 \) to your credit. In May 1959 a copy of Hartman's ETHIK was sent to you by your order through our book-dealer, E. Mecklenburg Company. The book cost \(\frac{1}{2},000. - \) for which I beg to enclose the receipt of our payment with sincere apologies for this delay.

The two books, ETHIK and SCIENCE AND CIVILIZATION IN CHINA, Vol.III, came up to \(\frac{47}{336}\).— which covers up the sum of \(\frac{46}{019}\).— which we have held to your credit — with a surplus of \(\frac{41}{317}\). Please just ignore this surplus as we are very happy to take care of it ourselves. We do hope the books you have got are all satisfactory and once more we thank you for your patience in waiting so long and forgivning our blunders in the transactions.

Evidently Cambridge University Press has sent to you two copies separately of SCIENCE AND CIVILIZATION IN CHINA, Vol.III. I am writing directly to Cambridge University Press, London, asking them to attend to this mistake on their part. So please hold the two copies until you will hear directly from the publishers.
