My dear Professor,

I have to thank you for yours of the 5th, and your suggestions as to the Hejaz letters, which I propose to follow, as soon as other engagements will allow me to arrange about a volume of Kleinere Schriften such as you indicate



I have received from the Christ's College Librarian, on loan, our friend's intereared copy of Kinship, and have caused a copy of his notes to be made. They bear evidence of having been made at various times, and some of them are rather hurriedly written. I think the copyist has succeeded in deciphering most of them fairly well;

but it is probable that
that you may wish to have
some of them verified, or even
that you may, before you are
done with them, wish to see
the volume itself. In this
event, I have no reason to
apprehend that the consent
of the Christ's College author-
ities will be withheld; but
I have judged it best in the
meantime to content my-
self with sending the

present copy, which I am
sure you will find inter-
esting.
