My dear Professor Goldzher:

You see how far your postal-card of Feb. 6th has travelled in order to reach me. Let me, first of all, say what pleasure it has given me to see your handwriting again; and to get into communication with you. I have so much missed the occasional postal-cards that came from you.

In regard to Dr. Sirley's translation of the "Kitab al-fark", I ought to say that it contains only the first half of the book. I have worked over it very conscientiously with her. She is now in Brant, where her husband is professor in the American College. She is a niece of Talcott Williams, whose occasional papers in the JAOES you have, probably, seen. Unfortunately, the book is not printed as nicely as I would have wished; but it was done during the war-days, and it was quite impossible to get good paper. Talcott Williams himself is to do the second half of the book, which will be pub-

lished as the *Proceeding Volume* in my series. I have a
copy of the book on my table here; and if you can allow
me to wait some three weeks, I shall be only too glad to
send you my copy for your library. You will, I hope,
accept it as a mark of my esteem and friendship.

I hope that you have seen the translation, from another
of my students, Dr. Hitti, of the first part of Balaam's
"Festal." The second half is to be published by Thos. Stew-
art. I consider it a useful piece of work to make these
books accessible to the general public of scholars, in exact
translations.

In regard to the Q.O.S. I shall write at once to Prof.
Montgomery. It is possible that the volumes have been
sent and have been lost in the Post Office. This has
occurred so often. But I shall give all the particulars
and I have no doubt that the missing volumes will be for-
warded. I am publishing in the coming volume a
little work (vol. 3), a polemic against Jews and
Christians for certain strange *ibn al-Wazîrî*.

I have on my table a copy for the library of your
"Festschrift des Islamischen Archäologen." I suppose
my copy has gone to Nogah, as the *de Goeje*
Society generally sends me its publications. Your book is
a fine piece of work; and I am glad to find my old friend Mo-
hammed Abduh there. I wonder whether his influence has
been of any permanent character there.

We are here for the winter, where I am giving a course
of lectures on the invitation of the University authorities.
