DEAR SIR!

The American friends and colleagues of the late lamented scholar, Rev. Dr. ALEXANDER KOHUT, desire to do honor to his memory by inscribing to him a collection of essays and monographs on scientific theology and oriental themes to be issued in a large octave volume of about one thousand pages, by the well known publishing firm of S. CALVARY & CO. in Berlin, under the editorial management of the undersigned.

Recognizing the fact that the deceased savant had an international reputation as preacher, linguist, theologian and orientalist, it is but meet, that we, the American devotees, extend to our European colleagues a cordial invitation to cooperate in so worthy and noble an enterprise as this. The idea of compiling a memorial book in his honor, was, it is fair to state, first suggested by Mr. S. Schechter, M. A., the crudite Reader in Rabbinic at the University of Cambridge (England), who heads the list of foreign contributors.

The essays thus far promised by prominent scholars here and abroad, indicate the warm sympathy and esteem felt for the author of the "Arukh Completum", the anniversary of whose premature death (May 25th 1895) will thus be fittingly commemorated.

All manuscripts must be in the Editor's hands on, or if possible, before February 1, 1895, so that the work may appear at the aforesaid time.

No article is to exceed thirty (printed) pages in length.

They will be printed in the original languages composed by their respective authors, (French, German, English, Spanish, Italian, Hebrew, etc.) who are each entitled to 25-50 separate reprints.

The Contributors are requested to present clear, (if convenient, type-written) copies of their monographs, so as to avoid mistakes.

Proofsheets are at the disposal of each writer, although the Editor pledges himself to do full justice to the reading of all proofs. Persian, Arabic, Syriac, Hebrew, Samaritan, Ethiopic, Coptic and Assyrian fonts of type will be provided by S. Calvary & Co.
