My dear Professor Goldziher:

I am delighted to learn that you have accepted the invitation of our Committee to deliver a course of lectures on Islam. It is, however, essential for us to fix a date as soon as possible. Our Committee meets at the end of December in New York, and I beg to inquire whether you can not, by the time stated, at least let me know whether you can come from October 1907 to January 1908, or from January to April 1908, - or in 1909.
