discussion on the merits of Logic & Grammar
of which the text, with translation, was

Recalling, as we do, gratefully your review there of Vol II, we venture to hope that you may write something on this Vol. The Journal will await your decision as to this, & the translation into English is no difficulty, provided you are satisfied with the result. You will see from the Preface that the Editor has procured from India a Ms. of the third quarter of the work, & he has hopes of getting the last also. And the hope of getting to the intervening part has caused this Vol. to be III i.

The other volume may also interest you later in the year the best (Vol II) may be expected to appear. I have no knowledge of the language dealt with in the 'Introduction' & I find here such a difference of opinion on Mr. Blochet's work that an intimation from you as to the merits of this Vol. would be most valuable, & regarded as strictly confidential. Should you be led to notice the work anywhere in print, I beg that you will inform me, that I may see it.

I doubt not that you have received from Leyden the fasciculus of Buhstun's Hamassu - a work which has procured us from Prof. Noldke a promise of the ⁱⁱ.
