4. Fol 16^A. The lower part of the page
from page 19 is, except for the
'Castro' [L 61] quite blank.

Fol 5^A. Fols 5 & 6 were once
torn across & have been pasted together
skillfully. The tops of the text right
& below have got worn away, & have
been replaced by modern paper of the
same brown tint — & the whole of the
lower half of fol 4 has been thus
replaced (by the Museum).

That I can be of any use to you here
may, in part, compensate for my having
missed you in Hokaido. You & Bishop
Sen. H. will doubtless confer against
the Deford Congress, which is duly pro-
- gressing, & where we look forward to
seeing you both. You will, I hope,

benefit yourself by the sea, which must
