As I am about to publish the text and translation of the *Bustan al-'Uluk* Dr. Gotheil has referred your postal card to me for answer. I therefore take great pleasure in sending you the enclosed abstract of the chapter on man as a microcosm and that on the future world. As I understand that you are chiefly interested in the influence of Islam upon Jewish literature I have omitted almost all of the numerous references to *Talmud* and *Midrash* and have confined myself to the contributions of Arabian thought, chiefly the *Shu'rah as-Safa*. In some instances I have indicated on the other side of the abstract the exact page of *Dictionnaire* where Nathaniel's ideas can be found.
