Dear Dr. Goldziher.

I have heard that the post of Assistant Librarian in the India Office Library will soon be vacant. I should like to get this post as it would give me more opportunity of doing scholarly work than I have at present. I believe that Dr. Stein has spoken to you on my behalf.

Our English custom is that

in such cases candidates send in
testimonials from eminent persons.

May I ask you to be so kind
as to help me in this matter.

The authorities of the India
Office would attach great weight
to a recommendation from you. As
scholars from various parts of Europe
visit the India Office Library,
it is desirable that the librarian
should be a persona grata to them.

If you will be so kind as to
accede to my request, will you please

mention that I was selected to be
editor of the Indian section of the
Encyclopaedia of Islam. It might
be helpful to me if you would also
mention that I was appointed English
secretary at the meetings of the
Muslim Section of the Congress of
Orientalists at Rome.

I shall especially base my application
on my knowledge of Arabic & Persian
and cognate Indian Vernaculars, — as
well as on my acquaintance with oriental
bibliography. I am engaged on a
short Persian text مجموعات فارسی which

I hope to publish next month.
I have at present in the press
a dictionary of ~~dis~~, ~~cis~~ which
I have written in Persian for the
use of Indian scholars, to serve
as a supplement to the existing
Arabic dictionaries available to
them.
