TENTATIVE PROGRAM FOR IAU COLLOQUIUM No. 65

IAU Colloquium No. 65, "Evolutionary Status of Variable Stars", will take place in Budapest, Hungary, August 25-28, 1981.

The colloquium will be mainly oriented towards review papers, which are expected to cover the following topics:

1. Superreview of stellar evolution.
2. Superreview of stellar pulsational instabilities and diagnostics.
3. Pre-main sequence variables (T Tau, FU Ori).
4. UV Cet flare stars.
5. Diffusion, rotation, variability in A and F stars.
6. Classical cepheids, Galactic and extragalactic.
7. RR Lyrae stars and Population II cepheids.
8. R CrB stars and red variables.
9. Cataclysmic variables.

In addition, approximately thirty ten-minute contributed papers will be accommodated on the program. Participation is by invitation only, so persons wishing to give such a paper should submit a request, together with a title and abstract of their paper, to the undersigned before April 1, 1981. The selection of papers will be made at that time and all persons immediately notified. Requests for invitations from persons not wishing to give a paper must be made before May 1, 1981.

Dear Colleague:

My thanks to those of you who responded to my last letter on the subject of the program and speakers for our colloquium next August in Budapest.

The following points have emerged:

- (1) Several of you questioned the need to have a section on B-stars at all, since there will be a workshop on them in Nice next summer anyway. I have therefore removed them from the program.
- (2) Two of you recommended another superreview paper on the subject of types of stellar instabilities and diagnostics. I have included this.
- (3) Several of you wanted to have UV Ceti and cataclysmic variables in the program, pointing out that in the latter case most Europeans will be unable to attend the workshop on the West Coast of the U.S.. I've put these groups in, making room by combining R CrB stars with red variables.
- (4) Other suggestions included pulsating white dwarfs and eclipsing variables (unless the latter suggestion was another vote for cataclysmic variables), but I just don't see any way of fitting these in.

I think it is getting too late to attempt any further iteration of ideas on the program, so unless I get immediate and very loud complaints, we will adopt the program outlined on the enclosed sheet. I will try and get the review speakers whose names appear first on the sheet; if they decline I will try others that appear in parentheses. Those of you whose names are on the list please let me know if you cannot do the review; otherwise I will assume that you will be able to come and give the review.

There were no further comments from most of you on publication, so I am assuming that publication will be by the Hungarian Academy, with Bela Szeidl and Janet Lesh as editors. I will consult with them later on such matters as finding an English-speaking typist, etc.

Enclosed with Bela's copy of this letter will be an outline of the program which I will ask him to put out in the IBVS for advertising. I will also send it to the IAU's assistant secretary-general, and to those who have written to me making tentative enquiries. I shall advance the deadline for those wishing to give papers to April 1 (i.e. the request with abstract must reach me by then), and May 1 will be the deadline for requesting a non-paper invitation.

We have yet to decide the matter of distributing the small IAU travel grant (total SF 3000 or about US \$1800.) Our recommendations must be in to the IAU secretariat by May 1, but I suggest we postpone decisions until we know who wants to come.

IAU Colloquium No. 65

Dear Colleague:

I am happy to announce that the IAU has given its formal approval to our proposed colloquium in Budapest next August. Enclosed is an announcement giving preliminary details, and I ask Bela Szeidl (if he considers it OK) to please put it out as an IBVS.

The IAU assistant general secretary pointed out that IAU Colloquium No. 66, "On the Problems of Solar and Stellar Oscillations", is due to take place in the Crimea September 8-10, 1981, and asked whether that meeting might be made a week earlier and our meeting a week later than scheduled to make it easier for some people to attend both. I am sympathetic to the idea, but nevertheless have decided not to change our dates. For one thing, North Americans find it difficult to attend meetings in Europe in early September because that generally coincides with the start of their academic year. For another, the existing dates have already been advertised and a change will result in confusion. And finally, I presume that the local organizing committee and the Hungarian Academy of Sciences have already started planning based on the existing dates. In any case, I've just noticed that if both colloquia change as suggested they would become coincident!

On the subject of review papers versus contributed papers, while most of you like the idea of leisurely reviews and discussion, several of you are also concerned that having no contributed papers would lead to a poorly attended meeting because often people cannot get travel money unless they give a paper. I therefore propose that we have a strictly controlled mix, with the following basic scheme:

Presumably each day will be broken into morning and afternoon sessions, each about three hours long. Within each session have a one-hour review paper, followed by forty minutes of discussion. Then a twenty-minute coffee break, and finally four ten-minute (plus five minutes discussion) contributed papers. With eight such sessions this would allow a total of about 32 contributed papers, which seems not unreasonable. What do you think? Donald Fernie

As to actual topics, I have tried to come up with something a little different to the usual standard list that we tend to have over and over again. It is shown on an enclosed sheet, with some very tentative suggestions for reviewers. Some notes: almost all of you liked the idea of a superreview paper on evolution generally, so I think we should start with that. Brian Warner, president of Comm. 42, tells me there will be a workshop on cataclysmic variables in Santa Cruz next summer, followed by a colloquium on them before the next IAU, so I have left them off our program entirely.

I emphasize that this list of topics and reviewers is only tentative. I really need your help here, particularly as to reviewers. Bob Stobie told me that in trying to arrange the Los Alamos meeting this past summer he had great difficulty getting reviewers. Many were willing but could find no travel money. I think therefore we might be wise to bias our choices towards Europeans, and I ask you to please let me have suggestions (topics and persons both.)

Finally, the matter of publication. Bela Szeidl has offered to be editor if it is decided to publish the proceedings through the Hungarian Academy of Sciences and if he can have help from a native English speaker. Janet Lesh has offered help in such a capacity. However, I did receive a complaint that when this was done once before (publication by the Academy) it became very difficult to obtain copies in the West, and that we should ask Reidel or Springer to publish. This, however, would make it expensive and difficult for our Eastern-bloc colleagues. It seems to me that there is not usually any serious difficulty obtaining the Academy's publications in the West, so if Bela can assure us that distribution problems are unlikely I am inclined to accept his offer. Your comments please.

Some of you may find it preferable to communicate with me by telex, in which case I can be reached at 065-23453 UOFTORONTO TOR. Perhaps those of you in Europe would let me have your telex listings if available. In any case, please let me have your comments by late November so I can start chasing reviewers.

NOTICE CONCERNING IAU COLLOQUIUM No. 65

IAU Colloquium No. 65, "Evolutionary Status of Variable Stars" will take place in Budapest, Hungary, August 25-28, 1981. The chairman of the Scientific Organizing Committee is Dr. J.D. Fernie (David Dunlap Observatory, P.O. Box 360, Richmond Hill, Ontario, Canada L4C 4Y6), and the chairman of the Local Organizing Committee is Dr. B. Szeidl (Konkoly Observatory, 1525 Budapest XII, Box 67, Hungary).

It is expected that the colloquium will be heavily weighted towards review papers and extended discussions, but approximately thirty ten-minute contributed papers may be accommodated as well.

Persons wishing to participate should note that attendance at IAU colloquia and symposia are by invitation of the Scientific Organizing Committee only. They should therefore write to Dr. Fernie requesting an invitation.

However, the issuing of an invitation will not automatically entitle the participant to present a contributed paper. Persons wishing to present a paper must clearly state this when requesting an invitation (preferably giving a title and short abstract), and these requests must be made by March 15, 1981. A selection of about thirty papers will be made at that time and all persons immediately notified.

A final list of participants requiring visas must be in the hands of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences by June 1, 1981. Requests from such persons for invitations should therefore arrive no later than May 1, 1981.

A small IAU financial grant for travel purposes has been made available to the SOC, but this will most likely be used to aid one or more review speakers.






Dear Dr. Szeidl,
