In answer to your post card of the 14th inst. I write to say that the Transactions of the Congress are not yet ready. The revision of the proof sheets of the index and the list of errata for one paper (vol i) delayed matters two or three weeks. Everything is now, I believe, in order and the complete copies of the work

should be available for sending
to members within the next few
days. I will take care that
your copy is sent off among
the first. With regard to your
reprints. As soon as we can
get the work issued in a
complete form, there will be
a certain number of copies broken
up to provide separate reprints
of their papers to all authors who
wish to have them. You will
receive 20 of these. But I must

beg you to wait a little longer
till we get the work complete.
A few of the authors asked for
an extra number of their
^(reprints) papers, and two or three have
already received them at their
urgent request. All the others
will have theirs forwarded at
the same time.

Do you hear anything of
next year's Congress? It was
decided to hold it at Geneva
and Prof. E. Naville had
charge of the arrangements.

But I have heard nothing latterly
of the subject.
